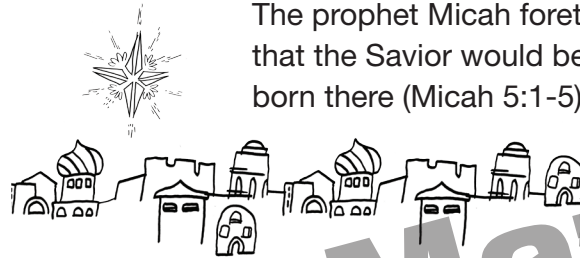

## Take a Look

Here are some of the people and things in today's story. What can your child tell you about them?

**Bethlehem** is the city where Jesus was born. The prophet Micah foretold that the Savior would be born there (Micah 5:1-5).



**Shepherds** were considered ceremonially unclean and banned from synagogues and temples. The angels' appearance to them revealed the depths of God's grace.



**Angels** were powerful messengers who were usually feared by God's people. Their first words to humans were, "Do not be afraid!"

## About the Video

After much anticipation, Jesus was finally born. Joseph and Mary had taken a long journey and had not found very good accommodations, but the angels and shepherds celebrated anyway. Our Savior was born as an innocent baby.
