At least 19 states have an official state policy, stating that employment in the community is the first and preferred service option for people with disabilities.

# 46 States

There are 46 states with some type of effort focused on Employment First.

- Persons with disabilities experience the highest rates of poverty of any other subcategory of Americans (28.2% in 2015)
- There are 52 million people with disabilities in the U.S.
- It is estimated that SSI annual payments will reach over \$1 trillion by 2018

## WHAT DOES “EMPLOYMENT FIRST” MEAN?

Employment First means that employment in the general workforce should be the first and preferred option for individuals with disabilities receiving assistance from publicly funded systems. This translates into regular jobs like everyone else in society: in typical work settings, working side-by-side with people

without disabilities, earning regular wages and benefits and being part of the economic mainstream of our society. APSE supports Employment First to facilitate the full inclusion of people with disabilities in the workplace and community.

## WHY SHOULD I ATTEND?

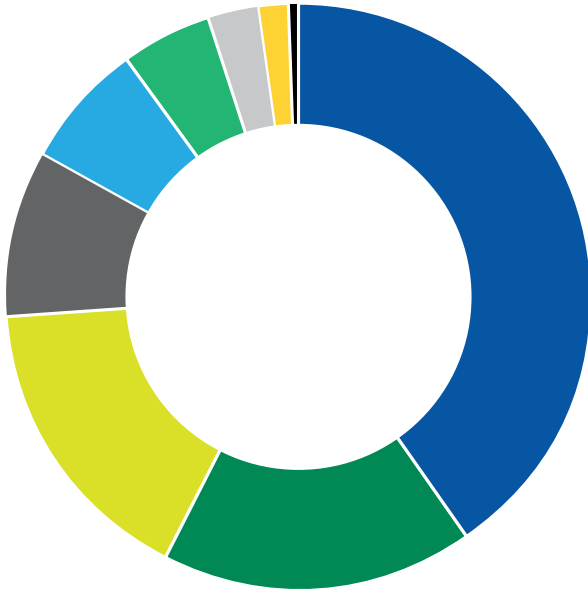
The APSE National Conference is the largest event for integrated employment. The event attracts
