What is the purpose of this Privacy Notice?

This Privacy Notice gives you information about the personal data we collect about you in relation to Huawei France R&D Center, in relation to and with respect to your participation to the Hackathon and related events and activities for France, Spain, and Portugal, and further potential communication in relation to similar events as well as potential internship or job fair at Huawei, and how and why we process your personal data with respect to such event and related activities, as well as how to exercise your rights as a Data Subject.

The legal basis or bases we rely on to process the personal data	Huawei processes such Personal Data on the following legal bases: • Art. 6 (1) (a) of the GDPR Consent for certain data provided directly by the Data Subject (pictures, video recording);

Art. 6 (1) (f) of the GDPR - the legitimate interests pursued by Huawei. The processing of personal data is essential for our business operations and in our mutual interests to operate the platforms used to organise and perform the Hackathon; Art 6 (1) (b) of the GDPR - processing is necessary for the performance of a contract to which you are a party or in order to take steps at your request of the data subject prior to entering into a contract. Failure to provide your personal data will prevent you from participating to the Hackathon; Art. 6. (1) (c) of the GDPR - Processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which Huawei is subject (for example, the duty to keep the records to demonstrate the compliance with rules and conditions of the Hackathon and related Terms and Conditions of the Hackathon. Failure to provide your personal data will prevent you from participating in the Hackathon. Please note however, that the withdrawal of your consent will not affect any use of the information made before you withdrew your consent, nor does it affect any data processing based on another justification other than your consent. The Huawei recipients of the Directors, managers, and/or other employees within Huawei personal data group of companies (IT, HR) who are involved in such Huawei R&D activities and events.

How long we retain the Personal Data for

We process Personal Data for the time needed for the purposes above and for no longer than is necessary for the purposes stated in this Statement. Unless the Data Subject exercises the right of erasure, Personal Data will be retained for two (2) years from the end of the Hackathon. At the end of the contractual relationship, some of Data Subject's Personal Data will be archived for five (5) years to comply with Controller's legal obligations.

Third party partner

We, and/or affiliates mentioned above also have contractors and suppliers, which provide support and services, such as managing online platform and web page for such activities such as events.

For organisation and performance of the Hackathon, we partner with BeMyapp French company with a capital of 1.250,00 euros, whose registered office is located 18 Boulevard Michelet, 13008 Marseille, France - company registration number B 523 824 258 (Marseille RCS).

Some information may be collected by BeMyApp, in particular for purpose of:

- Managing your registration for the Hackathon;

- Communicating with you in connection to the Hackathon or prizes after the jury's decision on the Hackathon;
- Organizing the Hackathon and ensuring your safe participation to the Hackathon;
- Managing taxation and accounting in connection to the prizes allocated further to the Hackathon and results of the Hackathon.

Should BeMyApp need to transfer certain information for the purpose above, BeMyApp will ask you your authorization as per the Terms & Conditions for the Hackathon, and such data processed by Huawei will be then subject to such terms hereunder.

Transfer of Personal Data out of the EEA

Huawei is a world-wide group of companies, which operates not necessarily along the borders of legal entities and countries, but according to functions which may exist across various group companies and countries. Like most global organisations, Huawei has centralised data management systems in place which involve Personal Data being accessible by Huawei group companies outside of the European Economic Area.

In particular, we have R&D Centers and cooperation team members in various countries. We also have IT management systems as well as events, travelling and accommodation support, which are hosted and managed by our parent company (Huawei Technologies Co. Ltd.) and affiliates supporting events (Smartcom (Hong Kong) Co., Ltd.).

This international transfer of Personal Data is covered by appropriate safeguards for the transfer of personal data to a third country by adopting the standard data protection clauses adopted by the European Commission in accordance with the Committee procedure set out in Article 93(2) GDPR.
