

# Leading consignors optimistic about 2025 Lexington Selected Sale and their yearlings

The Standardbred world will convene in Lexington, Kentucky starting on September 29 to bid on the stars of the future in the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. While neither bidders nor sellers can predict the final sales prices or how the horses will ultimately perform when called to duty on the track, all signs point to a lively auction from the opening session full of regally-bred colts and fillies right through the four programs to follow.

What has consignors smiling in the days leading up to Lexington include a number of positive indicators for what is on the horizon as over 900 yearlings hit the sales floor. Strong purses, booming economic conditions and upward trending sales thus far from both breeds have some of the consignors at Lexington with the most opening night offering feeling good.

"The stock market has been great," said Kentuckiana's Bob Brady, who will sell 17 during the first session and 139 over the five days. "It is a good market and they are racing for a lot of money in every jurisdiction. Kentucky is really strong but the finals in Pennsylvania were good, New York was really good, Ohio has a heck of a program, and Ontario has always been good. The main thing is that they are racing for a lot of money and people know that.

"I think Kentucky pushed other jurisdictions to up their game. New Jersey and New York added to their programs to stay competitive."

Regional sales in both New York and Ohio checked in with positive results already in 2025. The Goshen Yearling Sale saw a 36 percent increase in gross and a 2.3 percent gain in average sales price. At the Ohio Selected Jug Sale a new high for gross sales of \$8.6 million was recorded as the number jumped 9.3 percent from 2024.

"The sales have been going very well," said Steve Jones from Cameo Hills Farm. "Historically you don't know when things are going to go in the wrong direction but I certainly don't see any signs of it. They are racing for too much money. Every jurisdiction; certainly New York and others. I would think the sales will be pretty much the same as last year."

"I was just at Keeneland the other day and watched a whole lot of money being thrown around at the [Thoroughbred] sale," said Crawford Farms' proprietor Michelle Panebianco. "Hopefully that flows over into the Standardbred sales this year. I just read something was sold for \$3.3 million. They are reserving horses for \$800,000 and \$900,000; wouldn't that be great."

While all eyes will be on opening night as averages have been inching closer to the \$200,000 level, Steve Stewart from Hunterton Sales Agency likes the fact that there is something for everyone throughout the sale and even the bargain shopper can come home with a diamond in the rough.

"The money has also been spread around quite a bit," said Stewart on how purses seem to be available to all types of horses and those who send them out. "I remember when it was [Jimmy] Takter and [Ron] Burke and Burke and Takter, and it doesn't seem to be that way

anymore. It seems like everyone can get a drink of water. Just using our consignment over the years, we sold Apex for \$525,000 last year and on the same day sold Endurance for \$14,000. That is as top and bottom as you can get on the same day and they turned out to be two of the best trotting colts in the country."

One sign that 2025 could eclipse the previous year at least in terms of gross sales is the layout of the yearlings. The original catalog lists 911 total yearlings, 515 on the trot and 396 pacers. That split shows an increase of 49 trotters and an equal decrease in the number of pacers. As pacers sold for just under \$60,000 and trotters just over \$85,000 on average in 2024, one could expect that the rise in numbers on the trot will produce gains in the sale.

Between Hunterton Sales Agency, Crawford Farms, Kentuckiana Farms and Cameo Hills Farm, they will sell 71 of the 120 yearlings on the elite opening-night session. We reached out to the main players from each of the sellers to get their comments not just for Monday's opener but also their consignments in general.

#### CRAWFORD FARMS

Crawford Farms sold some horses at Goshen this year which means they are only bringing the crème of the crop to Lexington. They will sell 46 in total and 13 on opening night.

"The ones we have going to Lexington include absolutely every yearling we have to sell, including fillies this year," said Panebianco, who admitted she wouldn't mind staying in on a couple of the fillies if the buyer was amenable. "I feel like there are brothers and sisters to amazing racehorses. Karl has a sister in there, and we have sibblings from Brandon Blvd and Ubrute, so hopefully we see more good things from

them. Our first day lineup is kind of a who's who, a lot of first foals from well-bred mares. I'm very excited about what we are bringing to market all four days."

Some of Panebianco's top picks on the Monday session, which starts at 7 PM (EDT), include:

# HIP 19 UMBRIA NEW JERSEY AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

This one is the first foal from Dan Patch Award winner Anoka Hanover and we've already seen Tactical Landing put forth a pair of Hambletonian winners as a stallion.

"That one is a stunning individual," said Panebianco. "I call him Karl 2.0. For me, he looks and acts just like Karl. I've watched him grow up and if you look at his video and see him on the ground, he is just stunning."

# HIP 34 EMI NEW YORK AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

Filly is from a mare in Corazon Blue Chip that sends out big-time earners, including Valentina Blu (\$556K), Fourth Dimension (\$409K) and Heart On Fire (\$402K) in the group. Looking at the video, she is a bit leggy but certainly moves nicely.

"We lost Corazon after foaling this year and she was one of the matriarchs of our farm. It was a really hard loss for us. But we have sisters and this would be one obviously. She is one that we really love and it is hard to put her in the sale but at some point you have to do business and make money," said Panebianco. "I think I know a good individual but sometimes they fool you. She just walks out and you are like wow! She's the nicest filly the mare has had."

# HIP 44 SEASIDE UBEAUT OHIO AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

From two-time Dan Patch winner Warrawee Ubeaut, this gal is a Downbytheseaside sister to Ubrute, who recently won the Kentucky Sire Stakes final at The Red Mie in 1:49 4/5. Viewing her on the video, she certainly looks the part of a well-built pacing filly.

"On the ground she is stunning," said Panebianco. "Ubeaut produced Ubrute from Tall Dark Stranger and the world has been very remiss about [his crops] out of the gate. If Ubrute can go out and keep producing big miles, he'll put Tall Dark Stranger on the map."

# HIP 63 OLIVER BLU NEW JERSEY AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

The first colt from \$860K winner Barn Girl is an Ecurie D-sired brother to Torrisi, who won the Zweig Filly Trot earlier in the year and has made over \$400,000 in her career.

"This colt is probably one of the nicest-looking individuals. He gets centerfold of the year. He's correct and a complete athlete. On the floor and in the paddock he is just wow. He is going to be out of his stall more than in his stall in Lexington," said Panebianco.

Not singled out by Panebianco but one that caught our eye was **HIP 92 OAKLEY DOKES**. Eligible in both New Jersey and Kentucky, the colt is the first foal from a sister to Hambletonian winner Ramona Hill. Check out his video and he blazes the way in the field, leading us to ask: Is she really that fast?

"He is [that fast]," said Panebianco. "I'll be dead honest, he is very small. I have liked him since I first saw him. When he came out into

that paddock he was lightning. My mouth was on the ground. He's perfect, butt down, wide, his legs extend behind him. He is a powerful little thing. Atlanta was powerful. I don't think Marion Marauder was that big. A lot of horses have big hearts. Sometimes they can be small and be good too."

Digging deeper into the later days of her consignment, Panebianco felt it wise not to sleep on the yearlings by International Moni and Ecurie D.

"International Moni has shown up very well for our yearlings this year. The jury was out maybe on whether he had the best books or top mares, but what I see with my International Moni's this year, and I'll say the same thing for the Ecurie's, I'm quite impressed with what is on the ground. I wouldn't hesitate to purchase one of them," said Panebianco.

Along those lines, those willing to save some of their budget for day three might check out **HIP 404 REDBOTTOMROYALTY**. According to Panebianco "she's special".

#### **HUNTERTON SALES AGENCY**

Just two years removed from leading all consignors at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale in 2023, Steve and Cindy Stewart's Hunterton Sales Agency seems poised to do it again this year due to sheer numbers. They will be selling a new high of 126 yearlings in 2025, topping the 2023 previous mark of 111.

"Some of the clients have gotten more and that is the reason we've gotten to 126. It's not like we picked up any new clients," said Steve Stewart. "We probably have more at Harrisburg than we've ever had, close to 60. People just keep sending us more and more mares and we end up with more and more horses."

With 29 selling on opening night and with Stewart representing a number of clients, we didn't want to put him on the spot to pick out a few. Instead we asked which one may be a sale-topper and then provided some HIPs with videos and pedigrees that stood out to us so he could comment.

# HIP 94 TURTLE DOVE NEW JERSEY AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

That she is the first foal from multimillionaire and Dan Patch winner When Dovescry is enough on its own to ensure ample bidding. That this Walner-sired yearling is a trotting filly, a sector which led in gross and average by far in 2024 ensures it.

"The When Dovescry [Turtle Dove] has the potential," said Stewart on a potential sale-topper. "I think if all you did was run around and buy Walner fillies it would be hard to think you didn't have a good chance to have a good horse.

"To me, the only issue with that filly is that she's not big and so often you get penalized by that at the yearling sales. You also see it when the mares come back as broodmares. A lot of ours like Emilie Cas El and Pizza Dolce . . . some of the best mares we've had are not big at all. You would almost call them small.

"She's not a tall filly but she is very long and balanced. That's the same as 93 [SOCIAL HOUR], the Lonely Lady filly. They are very similar.

HUNTERTON VIDEO SCREEN SHOT

They are very well-made and correct. I think they'll sell accordingly."

# **HIP 4 TYNDALL**KENTUCKY AND KENTUCKY STALLION BONUS ELIGIBLE

She's a sister to the great Mission Brief and Tactical Landing. The video looked good and that she goes early could help her price a smidge.

"She is not a big filly but she has it all," said Stewart. "One of the grooms from Finland that has been here for about 10 years, she said 'the family is there.' She didn't take care of Tactical Landing but she had Mission Brief and a lot of the others out of that mare. Southwind Serena just makes them different. They have a mind of their own but are highly intelligent and are easy to get along with. Just like Mission Brief was, when you call them she is the first one there."

# HIP 66 VAINQUEUR ONTARIO AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

HIP 66 is by Bulldog Hanover.

If you want a pacing colt that simply looks fast in his video, this is your guy. But the price won't be cheap since he's a Bulldog Hanover and the first foal from \$1.2 million-winning Dan Patch champion Fire Start Hanover.

"He's unbelieveable," said Stewart. "You never like to say 'if there is a better pacing colt you'll have to show it to me' but he is very close.

"My prediction is that this time next year Bulldog Hanover will be a top stallion. I have the same feeling as I had with Somebeachsomewhere. His foals are just bigger and stronger looking."

# HIP 78 EXQUIS NEW JERSEY AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

This mare's only other foal was Monserrate, a winner of \$479,833 as he

continues through his second season on the track. Third dam was also a good producer with a couple having made over \$500K. Her video is quite nice as she moves very fluidly.

"She is a very nice filly," said Stewart. "She is not heavy but she is very tall and lanky. She looks like a really fast filly."

# HIP 113 DOWN BY THE SEA OHIO AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

Colt is a Downbytheseaside brother to Horse of the Year Tall Dark Stranger and his size and stride are evident in his video. Mom Precocious Beauty also produced Beautyonthebeach (\$540K) and second dam gave us the speedy Sportswriter.

"He's very big colt and being a brother to Tall Dark Stranger doesn't hurt," said Stewart.

Stewart was kind enough to provide some HIPs that could fall through the cracks as they are later in his consignment. You may want to take a second look at these:

**HIP 461 GAMESTER**: Tactical Landing out of Chelsees A Winner – Brother to Hey Porter (\$199K).

HIP 487 OCEAN STORM: Chapter Seven out of Empressive Hill –

"The mare hasn't hit yet but this is a really nice colt."

**HIP 840 MUNICH**: Rebuff out of Angelina Chip – "He's a really nice colt that people might not consider because he's out of an older mare."

HIP 929 NEXT LEVEL COOL: Cuatro De Julio out of Princess Andi – "This filly, I own part of her. She is just so full of herself; all trot. I don't know if we've ever had one like that. Walner Payton was kinda of like that. She ended up selling for \$500,000. But who is going to be looking at Cuatro De Julios. I'm very interested to see how she races and how her energy transfers to the racetrack. She's like the bubbly person in the office that is always happy and you think, I just can't handle her today. But you love them to death because they are just full of life.

She took a good video but she's not all that big."

#### **CAMEO HILLS FARM**

Steve Jones will bring 44 to the sale and an even dozen for opening night inspection. All but two of his Monday options are trotters and while they lack dual eligibility, Jones is not concerned.

"I'm not worried about not being Kentucky eligible. With the exception of Hanover Shoe Farm in 2024 we had the highest average of any consignor at the sale and none of ours were Kentucky eligible," said Jones. "The New York program is better than the Kentucky program, there is no doubt about that. Just look at the number of eligibles. There are four times as many horses that are eligible in Kentucky who you have to compete against. Not being dual eligible doesn't strike any fear in me at all."

While the majority of Jones' consignment were raised at Cameo Hills, he does have a new client this year with some power. "We are selling a Captaintreacherous for Hot Lead Farm that is pretty nice [HIP 14 SKY BLUE LOU]. We are selling four from them and have never sold for them before," said Jones.

Of the opening night crowd for Cameo Hills Farm, Jones singled out a quartet that should garner plenty of attention.

# HIP 50 VALOROUS NEW JERSEY ELIGIBLE

Colt is from the small first crop of Alrajah One with only 11 foals registered. They paired the stallion with Dan Patch winner Venerable and this is her first foal.

"He looks like his mother and he's beautiful," said Jones. "I don't know that he will top the sale because you don't know what they are going to like, but he's certainly in the conversation."

# **HIP 60 DAY ONE DANDY**NEW JERSEY ELIGIBLE

Here is another Walner-sired filly and this one is the first foal from a consistent stakes performer in Delilah Hanover, a full sister to Delaney Hanover, who was third in the Hambletonian Oaks this year.

"She has a strong page with well-bred fillies. Her mother was an expensive filly herself," said Jones.

#### HIP 79 FLY LIKE A DOVE NEW YORK ELIGIBLE

What do you get when you combine Chapter Seven with a fast Bluebird Dove? This is her first foal and the family shows millionaire Perfect Spirit on the page.

"Her mother is a world champion, fastest 3-year-old trotting filly ever on a half-mile track. The mother had ability. There is plenty of page there," said Jones. "I've had several people inquiring about that filly. It is a nice page. There is a lot of speed in the family."

Digging a bit deeper into his consignment, Jones feels there is plenty of quality worth consideration.

"The Greenshoe filly out of Brickhouse Babe [HIP 220 SLAVE TO FASHION] is terrific," said Jones. "I realize some people are not Greenshoe fans but I suspect they'll be fans of that one."

"I'm selling a Bulldog Hanover colt the second night out of Night Music [HIP 292 THE MATTERHORN]. She's a Somebeachsomewhere mare and she had a Betting Line that made \$600,000, Night Hawk; not too many Betting Lines have done that. She also had an Always B Miki that had a record of  $1:48\,2/5$  and made over \$300,000. I think people will like that one.

"The Perfect Sting filly out of Philly Hanover [HIP 572 PHILLY'S STING] that I'm selling for Hot Lead, I think she'll be well liked."

#### KENTUCKIANA FARMS

No consignor will sell more yearlings at the Lexington Selected Sale than Kentuckiana Farms. They have 140 in the catalog and co-owner Bob Brady is thrilled with his group.

"I'm really happy because the individuals match up with the pedigrees, which is not always guaranteed. This year in particular the right horses look like they are supposed to look," said Brady. "It is a very deep consignment. There is a lot of quality throughout and it is not just opening night, it is day one through five, particularly day four has a lot of nice horses in it. There just wasn't enough spots to get them in on days two or three due to the number of horses in the sale."

Bidders will notice an addition to the Kentuckiana collection as they take on the Brittany Farms consignment with them no longer handling it themselves.

"I think with the addition of the Brittany Farms yearlings it has added a lot of pacers to our consignment which we didn't have in the past. I'm really excited about our first year selling for Mr. Segal and Brittany Farms," said Brady.

Like Hunterton, Kentuckiana Farms is selling for a number of clients including Brittany, Marvin Katz, Al Libfeld and others. With that, we did the usual pedigree and video inspection and asked him to comment on a few.

#### HIP 17 HE'S MONI NEW JERSEY AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

Lots of family here and he's a brother to Looks Like Moni (\$564K) and related to Dan Patch winner Snow White. If that isn't enough, he certainly trots nicely in his video.

"Thats All Moni's Walner colt is outstanding," said Brady. "He's gorgeous; a great looking individual who is correct and checks all the boxes."

# HIP 70 DEJEUNER NEW JERSEY AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

This gal is a Walner sister to French Champagne, who earned nearly \$600K on the track. She's also from the family of millionaire French Wine and there is much to like about the way she trots in her video

"The French Café filly is exceptional and beautiful with a giant pedigree," said Brady. "[She] has the ability to be a sale-topper type."

# HIP 102 MISS WHITNEY NEW JERSEY AND KENTUCKY ELIGIBLE

Filly is a first foal and from Muscle Hill. The family has produced three-time Dan Patch winner Ariana G as well as All The Time (\$931K). Not only does she have pedigree but is also a looker.

"She is very nice," said Brady.

Above is just a sampling of the 120 yearlings slated to sell on Monday night in Lexington. Each one has something to like, whether in the pedigree or in the individual itself. Deciphering which will produce on the track is far from an exact science. The only guarantee is that some will become champions and many will make in the hundreds of thousands in 2026 and beyond.

# Numbers way up for Canadian-based stallions at Lexington

It's hard to say that those who put together this year's Lexington Selected yearling catalog could have foreshadowed what the landscape would be when they slotted an increased supply of Ontariobreds to the auction. Yet judging from the results just last weekend at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the inclusion and increased supply of yearlings by young sires Cattlewash and Bulldog Hanover - in addition to the first crop from King Of The North - help bolster what is certain to be a popular auction, not just for buyers from Canada but from across the globe.

Cattlewash, a son of Somebeachsomewhere, has already made an indelible mark on the sport with his oldest foals just 3-yearolds in 2025. His son Beau Jangles rocked the racing world and remained unbeaten with a devastating performance in the Metro Pace on September 20 and gave his sire worldwide credibility in

Bulldog Hanover's first crop, limited to just 54 this year in Ontario, has also gotten off on the right hoof with a decent supply of quality performers headed by the She's A Great Lady runner-up Daya, a filly that made two solid moves through sharp fractions yet managed to stay connected with the runaway winner Loua Dipa. Daya was timed in 1:50 flat, indicating that Bulldog Hanover, the sport's fastest racehorse of all time by way of his 1:45 4/5 mile, has the capacity to pass that speed on to the next generation.

A healthy supply of yearlings will be on display and go through the ring during the sale that starts on September 29 and goes for five days until concluding on October 3 at the Fasig Tipton Pavillion in Lexington. Some 115 Ontario-eligible yearlings have been cataloged, a total that far exceeds numbers sold in the last few years.

Bulldog Hanover's much anticipated second crop has the numbers and the pedigrees to get placement on the coveted opening night of the sale and that's generally an indication that yearlings have the potential to reach six figures before the hammer comes down. HIP 42 on opening night is a filly named Zitch Dog Sgt that likely would have received plenty of looks had the sale been held this summer, but now following the explosive success in her pedigree she'll become a must-see yearling prior to the auction. Zitch Dog Sgt is a half-sister to the Canadian Pacing Derby and now Hoosier Park Pacing Derby winner Maximus Miki, as well as a half-sister to the Breeders Crown champion Ammo, consigned by the newly formed Alliance Bloodstock.

Horse sales veteran Bob Boni has become an integral part of Alliance and spoke about the filly. "She's a very nice individual," Boni said. As for his opinion of Bulldog Hanover's chances: "With any regional stallion it's important that they show they can have a horse that can go beyond that and race on the Grand Circuit."

Given the flawless pedigree that Zitch Dog Sgt possesses there is every reason to believe she'll succeed in Ontario and the rest of North America as a 2-year-old in 2026.

Steve Jones' Cameo Hill Farm is another believer in Bulldog Hanover, and they have a strong consignment at the Lexington auction with six from Bulldog's second crop.

Jones was bullish on Bulldog Hanover for good reason.

"I think when you look at the kind of racehorse he was as a 2-year-old vou saw the ability. He raced well at 3 but then at 4 was unbelievable." said Jones. "In this business we've been searching for the stallion to breed to that can succeed with the Somebeachsomewhere-line mares. We've tried the Betting Lines and Tall Dark Strangers, and I think Bulldog Hanover could be the one."

"In this business we've been searching for the stallion to breed to that can succeed with the Somebeachsomewhere-line mares. We've tried the Betting Lines and Tall Dark Strangers, and I think Bulldog Hanover could be the one,"

From the strong Cameo Hill's consignment, HIP 84 Money Carlo figures to capture the most attention by yearling buyers as well as breeding farms. Money Carlo's pedigree suggests she'll have a bright racing future and after that a solid broodmare career. The reason is easy to see on paper, as the filly is from the extraordinary maternal family of Captaintreacherous. The Somebeachsomewhere dam Shes Some Treasure is a full sister to that super racehorse and now leading sire, and she's had solid production as well from her first offerings. Shes Some Treasure, from her first three foals, all fillies, produced the \$650K winner Mikala and another pair of stakes-winning youngsters, all with sub-1:50 records.

With a total of 45 yearlings in the auction, more than a third of Bulldog Hanover's 132 registered foals from his second crop will change hands in Lexington this week.

The supply will be more limited for Cattlewash's third racing crop but that may boost the prices with just a dozen going on the block spread out over the final four days of the sale. Winbak Farms has a pair slated for the second day, with HIP 175 Businmotion and HIP 307 Pistolpackingpatty worth long looks.

Businmotion is a colt and first foal from the 20-time winning mare Under The Bus and according to Winbak's yearling manager James Ladwig, is "big, good-looking colt that acts the part." He did add that he's currently a ridgling.

Pistolpackingpatty's dam Maid West has had a long and established broodmare career and could get a huge boost with her first match to a Somebeachsomewhere-line stallion. "She's one of my favorite fillies in the sale and is a great individual from a great family," said Ladwig.

HIP 258 is a filly named Ranch Water from All American Harnessbreds and she offers pedigree and racing potential with eligibility in Ontario, Maryland and Kentucky. Ranch Water is the first foal from Margarita Time, a half-sister to Tequila Monday from the maternal line that produced Bolt The Duer.

'She is one of my favorite yearlings we have to offer this year," said Rob Tribbett of All American. "She is such an outstanding individual that we had planned to bring her to Lexington even prior to the breakout season Cattlewash has put together."

King Of The North's pedigree should be enough to stamp him as a horse with great stallion potential, but that would be dismissing his rugged racing career. A son of Walner from the champion mare Check Me Out, King Of The North's first crop will see 17 yearlings go through the ring at Fasig Tipton. HIP 152 will be the first of that grouping to sell on Tuesday and it's worth noting that Jameson Deo. a colt eligible both in Ontario and New Jersev, is a half-brother to Up Your Deo, the 2023 Yonkers Trot champion that returned this year to capture the \$200,000 Robert Miecuna Trot in faster time than the International Trot on the same afternoon program.

HIP 261 is certain to get plenty of attention among the first offerings

by King Of The North. Highland Firen Ice is a filly and half-sister to the 2023 Hambletonian runner-up Highland Kismet as well as this year's Pennsylvania Sire Stakes champion Highlandstarburst. With just three foals of racing age, the dam Highland Top Hill has already stamped herself, and with Highland Firen Ice she's produced her first foal from the Chapter Seven-Walner stallion line.

The Kentucky auction is likely to draw a solid contingent of Canadian bidders and buyers, but U.S.-based owners and trainers should pay close attention in order not to miss out on a quality selection of horses likely to cross borders and compete in 2026 and beyond.

#### Louprint reclaims No. 1 in weekly Top 10 poll

Little Brown Jug winner Louprint returned to No. 1 in the Week 15 edition of the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll while Beau Jangles moved into the top five and Apex joined the Top 10.

Louprint, unbeaten in nine races this year, collected 23 of 35 firstplace votes and reclaimed the poll's leading position, which he held previously for the first seven weeks of the season. Yo Tillie, who was idle last week, dropped from No. 1 to No. 2 in the rankings. She received 10 first-place votes after spending one week in the top spot.

Miki And Minnie (idle) remained third and was followed by Metro Pace champ Beau Jangles and Twin B Joe Fresh (idle) in rounding out the upper half of the Top 10.

The next five in the rankings were Sylvia Hanover, Lexus Kody, Super Chapter, Emoticon Legacy and Apex.

Sylvia Hanover won the Fillies & Mares FFA at Woodbine Mohawk Park, Lexus Kody finished a dead-heat first with Periculum in the Caesars Trotting Classic, Emoticon Legacy won the Canadian Trotting Classic, and Apex captured the Mohawk Million.

#### California Harness Racing to return in 2026?

Sources have told DRF Harness that Watch And Wager LLC., which operated racing at Cal Expo in Sacramento, California until the track was forced to close in May by the California State Fair Board, is in lease negotiations with Big Fresno Fair to conduct harness racing in 2026.

If agreed upon, the lease and racing dates would have to be approved by the state and the Fresno board. Should everything go smoothly a decision could be reached before the end of 2025.

According to previous reports, a Standardbred meet at Fresno would start in December 2026 and last through April 2027 if it gets off the ground. Racing would be conducted during daytime hours since the facility does not have lights.

Cal Expo formed a circuit with Running Aces in Minnesota where horsepeople would race in California from January to April, at Running Aces from May to September, and then return to the Golden State. With Running Aces closing for the season on September 20, some trainers and drivers have already chosen new locations to compete, at least for the short term.

Cal Expo regular Gerald Longo was seen at Shenandoah Downs in Virginia on Sept. 20 and 21 with seven horses in action. Jesse Pacheco has horses at Monticello on Sept. 29. Luke Plano is listed on horses racing at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

Monday's (September 29) opening session of the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale is loaded with top prospects that should have the bidding board spin-



ning throughout the night. In this piece, we'll look at 20 yearlings that caught my eye, but certainly that number could have been much higher.

#### HIP 2 OPTN VALENTINE SGT

Captaintreacherous sits in the top five for all-age, 3-year-old and 2-year-old earnings by progeny this year, and here's a chance early on Monday night to grab the first foal out of a two-time O'Brien Award winner in Scarlett Hanover. A Bettor's Delight mare, she posted a mark of 1:49 4/5 and earned over \$946,000 during her racing career.

#### **HIP 4 TYNDALL**

You'll want to be in your seat before this Gimpanzee half-sister to Mission Brief and Tactical Landing goes through the ring. "She's a nice filly. She's not real big; she's a May filly. She's put together correct, looks good and you can't fault her. She looks the part," said Jim Ladwig, the Yearling Manager for Winbak Farm. "Being the only Sweet Lou filly on night one, that's got to help."

### Industry players chime in on yearling shopping for families



#### **CONFESSIONS**

It is fall and the yearling sales are in full swing. Soon breeding farms will begin prepping for next year's breeding season, breathlessly promoting their stallions with glossy four-color ads. We will learn that XYZ is the fastest trotting son of What'shisname to stand in Indiana and that Whatdayakonow is a world champion and the fastest stallion standing in New York.

Stallions are an important part of breeding. They contribute 50% of the genetics, and they get a lot of press, but any breeder will tell you the mare is more important. Just as Abigail Adams wrote to her husband John during the Continental Congress of 1776, we too must "remember the ladies."

Why is the mare more important than the stallion even though she provides the same amount of genetic material to the foal? Simple. Most male horses are gelded and (generally) only very good horses are bred. So that side takes care of itself. But every mare can be bred. She may have been a great race mare or she may have been unraced. She could have a great pedigree or she could be by a stallion you never heard of from a mare who pulled a buggy.

I talked to some of the sport's top yearling selectors and breeders to ask what they looked for in a mare, and while their answers differed, they did have one thing in common.

Myron Bell told me simply, "Stallions are overrated. It's a game of mares." An interesting comment from the man who managed Captaintreacherous's career and is heavily involved with him as a stallion.

As to pedigree, 2025 Hall of Fame inductee Bob Boni, whose latest venture is Alliance Bloodstock, said it best: "read the pedigree from the bottom up. If there are fourth and fifth dams listed in the catalog, there hasn't been much production."

Bell said the exact same thing to me when I asked about the key to reading a pedigree. "From the bottom up," he said.

When asked specifically about third dams (they would be the yearling's great grandmother) who have produced World Champs, Joe Sbrocco said, "I would agree with that. I like to at least look at the second dam (grandmother) for World Champions or top performers and going back to the third dam is good, too."

One place Boni diverges from many evaluators is that he skews heavily to performance. "I want to see a good race mare," he said. "Not necessarily the best, but the one who was chasing the best all year. She's busting her (behind) to beat that top horse, so you know she has ability and heart."

Bell agreed to a certain extent: "I look for real horses . . . not just money earned. That's just me. Some people like chocolate, others like vanilla. It's not a science. A real horse will have money earned, but generally we are talking about a mare with a lot of wins on her card, with a good lifetime mark.

What about purchasing the sibling to the hot race horse of the year? Sbrocco said, "I have many times purchased yearlings based on siblings performance and found that in the long run, we have paid much more and would've been better off not to do that. The bottom line ends up not as profitable as if we had bought on pedigree alone."

"Most mares will have one good one," said Bell about your chances of success staying with the same family.

Boni put it this way: "Look, most mares have one really good foal. There are exceptions. But look at Lushkara with Camtastic. She got eight more to the races, but combined they did not make half as much money. Mares like Lismore (Albert Albert was her best, but she had five others earn over \$500K) is an exception, as is Amour Angus on the trotting side (Andover Hall, Angus Hall and Conway Hall all earned over \$800,000). More recently Classic Wish, who was a pretty good race mare, has three

millionaire sons in Bettor's Delight, No Pan Intended and Roll With Joe. But great race mares Town Pro (Darlins Delight), Three Diamonds (Life Sign) and Terrys Woe (BJ Scoot) only had one really good offspring each. Terry's Woe was a perfect 10 of 10 producer, but only BJ Scoot made over \$120,000. You can go on and on with these examples."


Ironically, none of the three listed above excelled with their first foal, which is often considered to be a major plus factor when selecting a yearling and neither Sbrocco, Bell or Boni think it's a big deal. So why are there so many first foals out there?

Boni has the simple answer: "There is no guarantee there will be a second or third foal.

First foals may be the best because the breeder picks the best available stallion for the first couple years. And if you look at the top producing mares, they will have that one good one, as I mentioned, but it could come at any time."

Jenna's Beach Boy and Bettor's Delight were first foals. Sweet Lou was a fifth foal and Somebeachsomewhere was a fourth foal. So there really is no rhyme or reason to it.

All three men agree that regardless of pedigree, you need a "proper" individual . . . .good size, standing square, wide airway and athletic looking. It can take a lifetime to get the hang of it. Bell and Sbrocco are both 84, while Boni is the young whippersnapper of the group at 77. All three continue to watch a lot of races as they look to acquire broodmares and all have suggested that a performer is favored over an unraced mare, regardless of the rest of the pedigree.

So you are walking into the sale, catalog folded in your back pocket, with pages folded down for potential buys. What should you do? We will give Myron the final word.

"Look at 100 to buy one," said Bell. "Work with good partners; egos can get in the way. Find the one you want and get him. I would rather get my first pick than my tenth pick. Don't settle. Expensive is cheap and cheap is expensive. Look, if it works out you didn't pay too much. If it doesn't, you did."

He and Sbrocco are both fans of regional programs, as well. They both basically said, not everyone can hit a home run, but a single or double can work out.

That's it for this time. I will be back next time to look at Session Five at Lexington. Now go cash  $\dots$  on that yearling purchase.

# Alliance Bloodstock makes Lexington debut

#### Combination of Diamond Creek & Northwood with plenty of options for all buyers



#### AT THE TRACK

The Lexington Selected yearling sale is nearly upon us and with it comes the advent of a new 'alliance' in harness racing. That partnership comes in the form of an alliance between Adam Bowden's Diamond Creek Farm and Bob Boni's Northwood Bloodstock Agency.

How did this alliance come together?

"Diamond Creek had over the years built a client base and was consigning more horses as agent than we were off the farm," said Shaun Laungani, Vice President of Diamond Creek Farm. "The timing was right with Bob (Boni) and gave us an opportunity to add wisdom to the team."

Boni agreed and added that this partnership had the seeds planted a few years ago, even if the alliance just sprouted this season.

"Having developed a relationship with Adam from when he purchased his very first horses at Harrisburg, we had initially talked about doing something together about three or four years ago and for whatever reason, it just did not work out," said Boni.

"Then last fall during the Kentucky Sale, sitting at his Diamond Creek consignment we brought it up again, and this time the time seemed right."

Boni believes that the combination of his experience and enthusiasm of the Diamond Creek team will make for a great partnership.

"I think we looked at the partnership as a terrific blend of experience and youth and energy, with me adding my experience and insight to what Shaun has along with a very eager staff of Sam Herrington, Caroline Vasquez, Emily Pursell, Andrew Kramer and Ashley Bough. Different roles and responsibilities for particular people, and in many ways it is somewhat like a football team orchestrating the efforts of the defensive coordinator, the offensive coordinator, the special teams coach and the kicking coach, and coming up with a winning formula. I think we have done that, and I only anticipate we will get even better."

Lexington is on the horizon, but Alliance Bloodstock has already completed its first sale together, the Jug Sale in Ohio. Alliance sent 10 yearlings through the sales ring for a total of \$536,000, including a Downbytheseaside filly named McWallen who sold for \$115,000. She was consigned for Joe McLead and partners. Their average yearling price of \$53,600 was the second highest in the sale.

Laungani was quite pleased with the results in Ohio.

"We had our first sale in Ohio last week, it helped me realized we have a new story to tell and that not everyone has heard it. It felt fresh and new, and in a lot of ways it feels like starting over, which brings energy. The only thing I can envision is Alliance as an annual leader at the sales with size, strength and results. We were the leading consignor by average for more than four horses sold at the Ohio Jug Select Sale."

Laungani believes partnerships like this are vital to the business moving forward.

"We essentially merged Diamond Creek and Northwood Bloodstock consignments into the new Alliance Bloodstock. Even though it is our first year as Alliance, because of the merger we are quite sizeable and will showcase a large diverse group of horses for every jurisdiction. The goal is simple, help our clients achieve their goals with exposure, using our industry-wide network and of course, our sales and horse-manship know-how. At Alliance, we say "powered by partnership" and that is also true at Diamond Creek, who cannot operate without partners, clients, buyers and sellers. We are open to strategic partnerships that help us move the breed forward."

Boni echoed Laungani's sentiments. "As Shaun noted, the byline is

"powered by partnership," and being a strong believer in collaboration, I see it very much the same way with a strength in numbers."

Having strength in numbers is certainly on display in Lexington for Alliance. When looking at the consignor Index in this year's sales catalog, one will find 53 yearlings within the Alliance Bloodstock consignment as they launch this new venture.

We asked Boni and Laungani each for some of the yearlings they are looking forward to seeing go through the sales ring.

#### **Bob Boni**

To highlight the opening session, I will start with **HIP 2 CPTN VALENTINE SGT**, a colt by Captaintreacherous and the first foal from the Champion pacing filly Scarlett Hanover, the winner of nearly \$1 million and a good-looking and good-moving colt that is bred to compete at the highest level.

**HIP 28 SISTER GIRL BLUES** is a Captaintreacherous filly and the first foal from a full sister to the great World Champion [Warrawee Ubeaut] and her first foal is the Kentucky Championship winner of over \$250,000 UBRUTE p,2,1:49 4/5 – '25.

HIP 32 MEADOWLARK PARK is the first by leading sire Papi Rob Hanover from the accomplished stakes and Open winner, and stakes producer and winner of nearly \$2 Million Caviart Ally. HIP 42 ZITCH DOG SGT, by Bulldog Hanover, is not only a sister to three \$500,000 winners, but she is also a sister to arguably the top Aged pacer Maximus Miki, now the winner of nearly \$800,000 pacing to a track and stakes record 1:47 4/5 Friday night winning the Hoosier Park Pacing Derby.

HIP 35 ECHO IN THE VALLEY, a Chapter Seven filly and HIP 91 SEINE, a colt by Sweet Lou, are two others with the looks and families to make their stamp in the richest events, and should also not be overlooked.

Rounding out our Monday night offerings is a colt that I find especially interesting in **HIP 98 DEADLINE**, as he was described to me by Andrew Kramer as 'what a day one yearling should look like.' He is a very correct, good moving colt by Always B Miki and he from a 100% producer and a brother to the exceptionally talented undefeated 2-year-old pacing filly Be Perfect BG p,2,1:50 1/5 – '25.

### Lexus Kody, Ervin Hanover seek to keep rolling at Dayton

#### By Jay Bergman

Yonkers International and Maple Leaf Trot champion Lexus Kody hopes to continue his winning ways on Saturday with Hall of Fame driver Yannick Gingras set to guide the sport's leading open trotter in the \$250,000 Dayton Trotting Derby. The Dayton Raceway program features four major events for Open trotters and pacers as well as the rich Ohio Sire Stakes finals for 2- and 3-year-olds of both gaits and sexes.

For Lexus Kody, an altered son of Archangel, 2025 has been a breakout season with the 7-year-old trotting to the fastest mile in Canadian history, a 1:49 1/5 effort in the Maple Leaf Trot. He'll be looking to increase his yearly earnings above \$1 million in the Dayton Derby.

"He's always been a fast horse," said Gingras about his mount on Saturday. "It was just about taking the next step and not making breaks for no reason."

Lately it's been Lexus Kody winning in all ways possible and Gingras being the engineer in the sulky. The Maple Leaf and International saw him dominate on the front end and then last week in the Caesars Trotting Classic at Hoosier Park Lexus Kody attacked without cover and earned another major victory, despite ending up in a dead-heat with Periculum.

"They (Burke stable) took their time with him and waited for him to mature," said Gingras. "They figured it would come this year and that's why they made him eligible to these races.

"Now you can sit in a hole with him or come first over. In the past you had to go to the front with him," Gingras said about how Lexus Kody has turned the corner this year.

On Saturday, Lexus Kody landed the pole position in the field of nine with trainer Marcus Melander keeping Periculum out of the race and instead sending both Aetos Kronos S (post 2) and Security Protected

(post 3) to compete in the Dayton Derby. The field has some other solid players, including Charlie Hill Memorial winner Hillexotic (post 5) and Logan Park (post 6). Up Your Deo, the recent winner of the Robert

Miecuna Trot at Yonkers Raceway on International Trot Day (September 13), drew post eight for trainerdriver Ake Svanstedt.

On the pacing side, the post worked quite differently with Bythemissal landing the nine hole in the \$250,000 Dayton Pacing Derby. A \$2.5 million career earner, Bythemissal has been brilliant on occasion this year but at times hard to figure. In last week's Hoosier Park Pacing Derby (September 19) he finished eighth.

"He was a little lazy leaving the gate," said Gingras. "He was stuck behind dull cover."

Back in August, Bythemissal won in 1:46 4/5 in an elimination for the Canadian Pacing Derby but a week later had difficulty clearing pacesetter Ervin Hanover in the final and faded. "Louis Roy (driver of Ervin Hanover) was trying to let me go but he couldn't clear," Gingras said of the Canadian Pacing Derby final.

In addition to the difficult outside draw, Bythemissal will also have to contend with Canadian Pacing Derby and Hoosier Park Pacing Derby champion Maximus Miki (post 3) as well as the red-hot Captain

Albano (post 2), a recent winner in the Aria Invitational at Yonkers. Then there will be Ervin Hanover (post 4) shipping over in super form for trainer Dave Menary.

"He's undefeated on five-eighths mile tracks this year," said Menary half-jokingly about the 5-year-old son of Captaintreacherous during his biggest year on the racetrack.

Ervin Hanover has won seven of his 13 starts this year and Menary thinks the best may be yet to come. "He was vicious last year at the end of the season pacing miles in 47 and change when the weather got colder," said Menary.

A winner the last time he raced in Ohio on September 6 in the Ewart Memorial at Scioto Downs, Ervin Hanover hopes to reverse the decision that saw him lose a photo to Maximus Miki in the prestigious Canadian Pacing Derby.

"That was a tough one," said Menary of the loss. "He was on go from the start and never had a breather and then to get beat a head. If you had asked me before the year, I would have been ecstatic with a second in the Canadian Pacing Derby but going in there at 8-5. it stings."

Menary is hoping for a decent check in the Dayton Distaff Derby (race 9). Also going for \$250,000, Menary sends out Talk Curdy To Me (post 3) in the field of nine.

"I'm really happy with her. She came back to me (two starts ago) in great condition, and she was solid finishing second behind Sylvia Hanover last week," Menary said of the effort on September 20 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. "She always gives her best and hopefully she can follow Twin B Joe Fresh and Sylvia Hanover home."

Twin B Joe Fresh (post 4) meets archrival Sylvia Hanover (post 8) in the Dayton Distaff.

Gingras has one of the favorites in the \$250,000 Dayton Oaks Derby for open trotting mares with M-M's Dream (post 3) facing a solid field of nine.

"She's been great when we're able to race her without shoes," said Gingras of the 6-year-old by Swan For All that enters the Dayton Oaks following a victory at the Delaware Fairgrounds in the \$95,000 Miss Versatility final where she raced shoeless.

"It's a tough call; you have to have the right conditions to take the shoes off," said Gingras, noting that it's not something you can do every week.

M-M's Dream drew inside her main rivals, with Call Me Goo (post 7), Bravo Angel S (post 8) and Elista Hanover (post 9) all compromised to some degree in the Dayton Oaks.

In addition to the Dayton Derbys, Gingras has a great shot in the \$400,000 Ohio Sire Stakes final for 3-year-old colt and gelding pacers with Sippinonsearoc hoping to complete the Kentucky and Ohio Championship sweep in the process.

"Outside of Louprint I wouldn't trade him for any other 3-year-old," said Gingras with high praise for the son of Downbytheseaside.

A winner of five straight races the last time Sippinonsearoc was

defeated came in this year's Adios. "I really thought he had a great chance to win that day and he just came up short," said Gingras of the fourth-place finish behind Prince Hal Hanover.

Sippinonsearoc is one of five finalists hailing from the Ron Burke stable in the richest sire stakes final of the eight programmed at Dayton. "I was surprised to see we were going for \$400,000," said Gingras, "It turns out if there is no consolation they add that purse money to the final. I'm not complaining."

With the likely post-time favorite that makes sense.

The 14-race all-stakes card at Dayton gets underway at 6:30 PM (EDT).

#### Denarius looks to step out in Bluegrass

After bringing her along step by step, trainer Domenico Cecere will watch Denarius on Friday in a division of the Grade 3 Bluegrass Stakes for 2-year-old female trotters at Lexington's Red Mile in the hopes of seeing her continue to step up.

Denarius heads to her Bluegrass engagement off a two-length win in a division of the Grade 3 Champlain Stakes on Sept. 12 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. She won in 1:55 2/5, equaling her winning time in a division of the Kindergarten Classic Series in her career debut on Aug. 1 at The Meadowlands. Between the two victories, she finished second, beaten a neck, in a Kindergarten split on Aug. 23 at The Big M.

"She has just three races, but it looks like she is a very smart filly," said Cecere, who trains the homebred daughter of International Moni-Treviso for owner Moni Maker Stable. "I've always believed in her. I liked her when we were training down. She has a nice pedigree, and she always showed me she had some class. We respected that. We let her grow and went step by step and I'm happy with where we are right now."

Denarius is a half-sister to Kilmister, who as a 2-year-old in 2022 won the Peter Haughton Memorial and was third in both the Breeders Crown and Valley Victory. He also was a Grand Circuit winner at age 3 and finished second in the Earl Beal Jr. Memorial and a division of the Stanley Dancer Memorial.

Cecere trained International Moni, making the experience with Denarius all the more meaningful.

"I trained the father, and it's cool to bring along a 2-year-old that is a homebred," Cecere said. "It is more exciting. It's nice to see them grow up and be a good horse. We try every year to do that. That is our dream."

Denarius will compete Friday in the fourth of four \$94,500 divisions of the Bluegrass Stakes. She will leave from post two with Dexter Dunn in the sulky and is 6-1 on the morning line in a field of eight fillies.

Naked And Famous, who will start from post eight with Todd McCarthy driving for trainer Noel Daley, is the 5-2 morning-line favorite. The daughter of Six Pack-Sleep Tight My Luv was third, beaten a length, in the Kentucky Sire Stakes Championship Series final on Sept. 14 at The Red Mile, where she was timed in 1:52 4/5.

Lainey W, who has a mark of 1:53 4/5 and missed by a nose in the Grade 1 Jim Doherty Memorial on Sept. 12 at Harrah's Hoosier Park, is the 7-2 second choice. The daughter of Bar Hopping-The Black Beauty will leave from post five with Scott Zeron driving for trainer Marcus Melander.

In addition, the field includes Lipstick, a daughter of Tactical Landing-Non Stick who upset in 1:54 at odds of 44-1 in the New Jersey Classic final for freshman filly trotters on Sept. 5 at The Meadowlands. She will start from post three with David Miller in the sulky for trainer Anette Lorentzon.

"Now, we'll start to step up more," Cecere said about Denarius. "The fillies that she's going to be racing have been going in (1):52, (1):53, so it will be interesting to see how she does. She raced good in Canada; I was really happy with her.

"She has already showed us that she is a nice filly. She's been winning in (1):55, in a good way, coming home good. We'll see Friday how she goes, but she's feeling good, she's training well."

In the first Bluegrass division for the filly trotters, Leading Lady (Walner-Muscle Dolly) is the 9-5 morning-line favorite from post five for driver Yannick Gingras and trainer Nancy Takter. She has notched victories in New Jersey and Kentucky stakes action this season.

Kentucky Championship winner Country Glide (Tactical Landing-Sheer Glide) is the 6-5 morning-line choice in the second division, leaving from post seven for driver David Miller and trainer Melvin Schmucker.

Maya Patel Hanover (Captain Corey-My First Lady) is the 5-2 morning-line favorite in the third division. She is seeking her first win of the season but finished second in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes championship for trainer-driver Ake Svanstedt.

Friday's card, which begins at 1 p.m., also includes four Bluegrass divisions for 2-year-old male pacers.

Alrajah One IT bred a short book in New Jersey while he was being trained back to race then was shipped to Italy and will be considered a foreign stallion thus his 2024 foals will be considered eligible.

The list of Foreign stallions exempt from the Stallion Early Closer Participation payment with yearlings consigned to the upcoming sales have been added to the list of stallions whose progeny are eligible for nomination to Meadowlands on the web.

As promised, 50% of the estimated revenue generated by both the stallion and the February 15 payments on the foals of 2024 will be used to increase the money added to Meadowlands marquee Stakes/Early Closers listed below. These are the races that enhance the career of any horse able to win and are undeniably important as "Stallion Makers" on the resume of horses that potentially have a future in the breeding shed.
