

Virtual Reality Programme

The Cornerstone Partnership's Virtual Reality Library uses cutting edge technology to put participants in the shoes of children in care - delivering the knowledge, understanding and empathy that can take years to develop in just 6 minutes.

This pioneering programme aims to get children on their best path as quickly as possible by changing how teachers, carers and legal profes-sionals make decisions, interact and support children in care.



Emerging research suggests that people remember information better when presented through virtual reality compared to standard desktop-based learning. A 2018 study found that memory recall when using head-mounted virtual reality displays (HMD) was almost 10% higher than desktop-based displays. In a post-activity survey, the researchers found that 95% of participants preferred the HMD and stated that the total immersion allowed them to focus on the specific task resulting in fewer mistakes. 1

How can the Cornerstone VR experience benefit the social care sector?

- Providing an improved understanding of children's behaviour, needs and actions ensuring decisions reflect the best interests of the child
- Increasing empathy and understanding of children who have experienced trauma facilitating more targeted support
- Creating a shared understanding of trauma and attachment between carers and adopters helping to bridge communication barriers
- Potential cost savings due to improved recruitment, placement stability and encouraging more efficient processes
- Improving motivation and resilience of social workers and carers working in challenging environments
- More targeted recruitment and assessment of foster carers and adopters
- Participating in new, cutting edge approaches creates opportunities to contribute to best practice

Cornerstone VR has contributed to many success stories, helping place more children with complex needs and avoid disruptions, with substantial cost saving implications. For example, placing a child age 5 for adoption can **save** an LA over £425,000 in fostering costs alone, with wider cost savings as a result of improved life outcomes likely to be even more significant.






How can the Cornerstone VR experience benefit the legal system?
