Organizing Thoughts with PREP — Speakers who come off as the most logical and persuasive tend to start out by stating an opinion. They support this opinion with reasons (usually two or three) and examples. They use clear signaling and transitions. Finally, they complete their argument with a quick summary and/or recommendation.

Use PREP (Point, Reason, Example, Point) to help you organize your thoughts.

Example – Is now a good time to invest in real estate in Tokyo?

I really don't think it is a good time to invest in real estate in Tokyo **for two reasons**. **To begin with**, there are too many empty apartments buildings in Tokyo. **For example**, 80,000 condos were built last year, but only 40,000 were sold. **As a result**, many building owners cannot pay back their bank loans. **Furthermore**, Japan's shrinking population is causing construction costs to rise. **That is to say** that there are fewer workers in the industry, so labor costs are higher, and it takes more time to complete projects. **Given these points**, now is not the time to invest in real estate in Tokyo.
