<p>Arrival/ Pit Stop (3 MINUTES) Team consist of (3): 1 RN and 2 ED Medic 2 RN and 1 ED Medic 3 RN</p> <p><u>EXCLUSION CRITERIA:</u> -Patient comes in as “Code Blue” -Active seizures without advanced airway</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. EMS arrives in EMS bay 2. EMS Medic to Unit Secretary for Quick Registration 3. Patient to “Pit Stop” area on EMS stretcher (first person to pit stop starts the time clock) 4. IV access, labs and POC blood glucose obtained 5. SAVES assessment completed 6. Vital signs, stated weight, allergies, EMS data 7. Documentation completed 8. ED MD ABC’s and Quick Neuro 9. Charge RN professionally discusses with ED MD needs to Stroke Alert Order Set to be placed 10. TeleSpecialist MD on in background 	<p>EMS:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Arrive in EMS bay 2. Transport patient to Pit Stop area on EMS stretcher 3. EMS Medic to Unit secretary for quick registration 4. Report provided to ED MD and Pit Stop team <p>ED MD:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. ABC’s and quick Neuro 2. Place stroke alert order set <p>TeleSpecialist MD:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. On telecart in background for observation <p>Charge RN:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Complete VAN assessment on patient and discuss findings with ED MD 2. Professionally discuss placement of acute stroke order set <p>Pit Stop Team Member 1:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Obtain IV Access 2. Obtain Labs 3. Obtain POC blood glucose <p>Pit Stop Team Member 2:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. SAVES tool completed 2. Vital signs obtained 3. Stated weight obtained 4. Allergies verbalized <p>Pit Stop Team Member 3:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. EMR documentation of information that was obtained
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
