Mini Career Checklist for Aspiring Remote Workers

A quick guide to help you get remote-ready with the essentials that matter most.

A personalised CV

- Create a clean 1–2 page CV focused on outcomes, not duties.
- Highlight digital tools you already use (Zoom, Google Workspace, Slack, Notion)
- Include links to your LinkedIn, portfolio, or work samples

Optimised LinkedIn

- Optimise your LinkedIn headline by emphasising your career focus and using a professional profile photo.
- Write a simple "About" that highlights your key skills + interest in remote roles.
- Join industry groups (tech, design, customer support, writing, data, etc.)

Work-ready tools

- Get comfortable with email etiquette and calendar management
- Learn one project tool (Trello, Notion, ClickUp)
- Ø Practice video calls (Zoom, Google Meet) or video interviews with Jobberman AI Career Tool.
- Get familiar with Google Docs, Sheets, and Slides

Build proof of skill

- Create at least one portfolio piece or project.
- Join a learning platform (Propel, Jobberman Learning, ALX, etc.)
- Volunteer for small projects to gain experience

Create accounts on remote - accessible platforms

Try: Upwork, Fiverr, LinkedIn, Toptal, Designhill, Simply Hired, Jobberman, Dribbble, Guru, Freelancer, Peopleperhour, We Work Remotely, etc.

Set up payment channels for global work

Try: Payoneer, Wise, Grey, Geegpay, LemFi
