## Another large winter storm is set to effect much of the Midwest and Northeast this weekend

If today's frigid temps weren't enough, we'll get another wintry wakeup call this weekend. The system takes shape tonight over the Plains, and will strengthen as it moves to the east over the weekend. Similar concerns to last week for many areas; blowing snow to the north, flooding rains to the south and icy conditions in-between. Minnesota, Iowa, and Western Wisconsin will see the highest snow totals and potentially blizzard like conditions and lake effect snow is likely for the snowbelts of the Great Lakes. Travel is expected to be difficult for much of the Midwest over the weekend including Chicago, Cleveland and Buffalo. Upstate New York and New England will also see tough travel conditions Sunday as the storm jets off to the northeast.







## Storm Totals




Some things to consider when there is extreme weather:

- Most LTL carriers will operate in limited capacity (at some points even closing terminals). Even if freight is picked up, it may not move from the local terminal.
- Truckload carriers will likely operate as long as they feel it is safe for their drivers, however, we would recommend accounting for an additional day in transit to allow for delays.
- Consider the path of the shipment. If it is heading through an impacted area, it is likely your shipment may get caught in a delay.

- If you choose to upgrade service, be aware that weather delays are considered “acts of God” and could still cause delays in a shipment.

If you have a critical shipment, communicate with your CHR team as soon as possible. We will do everything in our power to create a plan that avoids any major disruption.
