

Our Creative Arts camp is a transformative program designed to engage young children in process-focused art experiences, such as storytelling, painting, music and movement. Over the holidays, children will uncover the life and works of three renowned painters – Andy Warhol, Van Gogh and Wassily Kandinsky. Each week, they'll be introduced to the history of the artist and be exposed to new visual and performing art techniques, and to aid in culminating learners who are confident in themselves and their abilities, children will deliver an open class presentation to parents and guardians at the end of each week.

Week 3 - Wassily Kandinsky

3 - 7 January

Children will learn about the artist, be introduced to his love of music and color in his artworks and create their own Wassily Kandinsky 'inspired' art piece to take home.

After submitting this form and included payment, you'll receive an email confirming your child's enrollment in this program.
- <u>Class Schedule and Age Groups:</u> Guidepost reserves the right to change and/or amend the class schedule and age groups as deemed necessary.
- <u>Inclement Weather Policy:</u> In the event of a Black Rainstorm Warning or Typhoon 8 signal classes will be cancelled.
- <u>COVID-19 Restrictions</u>: In the event that the Hong Kong Government implements a lockdown or other restrictions that prevent in-person activities, those activities will be replaced with online virtual offerings.
