



Churchgoers


Methodology

- The online survey of 1,815 Americans was conducted February 27 – April 8, 2019
- Respondents were invited to participate from a large national panel
- Respondents were screened to only include adults whose religious preference is Protestant and who attend once a month or more
- Southern Baptists were oversampled (457 completes) to provide reliable estimates for this subgroup, and subsequently downweighted
- Maximum quotas and slight weights were used for gender, region, age, ethnicity, education, and Southern Baptist affiliation to more accurately reflect Protestant churchgoers using statistics published by Pew Research
- The completed sample is 1,815 surveys
- The sample provides 95% confidence that the sampling error does not exceed $\pm 2.9\%$
- Margins of error are higher in sub-groups
- Due to mandatory reporting requirements, respondents could not be asked if they personally had been a victim of child sexual abuse or sexual assault




89% of church attendees agree someone who experienced abuse as a child/teen would find healing at their church




90% agree someone who experienced sexual assault as an adult would find healing at their church




Churchgoers are split on whether many more Protestant pastors have sexually abused children (32% agree)



Churchgoers are split on whether many more Protestant pastors have sexually assaulted adults (29% agree)




As a child or teen, most did not receive compliments that implied the adult viewed them sexually




Among those complimented, 47% knew the person from somewhere other than home, school, or church


















Combined responses to role of person if any misconduct was done by someone known from church:

Percentage of all churchgoers who experienced at least one type of misconduct at church





6% of churchgoers have ever attended less frequently because of sexual advances from other attendees




Q23: "Have you ever attended a church less frequently because other attendees made you feel uncomfortable with their advances or interest in having a sexual relationship?"


4% of churchgoers have ever stopped attending because they did not feel safe from sexual misconduct




5% of churchgoers have stopped attending a church because sexual misconduct was not taken seriously




14% of churchgoers know someone at their church who has experienced sexual assault as an adult




12% of churchgoers know someone at their church who has experienced rape/ attempted rape as an adult




Most churchgoers think someone sharing that they had experienced child sexual abuse or sexual assault would be treated by their church with respect and sympathy




94% agree their church is a safe place where children and teens are protected from child sexual abuse in church




93% agree their church is a safe place where adults are actively protected from sexual assault in the church




17% agree some attendees express physical greetings in ways that seem more than a simple gesture




76% agree someone attending their church can share that they have experienced sexual assault and be believed




94% agree leaders at their church communicate that women are valued




83% *disagree* that church leaders would try to cover it up if sexually inappropriate things happen at their church




82% agree their church is willing to correctly address sexual misconduct that may occur in church even if it is costly




87% say their church is likely (68% very likely) to report suspicions of abuse/neglect to the appropriate authorities



67% say their church teaches about sexuality by regularly affirming the value of every woman and man




If a pastor at their church was accused of sexual misconduct 75% would want a careful investigation




Q38: "Which if any of the following would be your reaction(s) if someone accused a pastor at your church of sexual misconduct? I would... (Select all that apply)"


When it comes to sexually inappropriate comments, 75% say church is better and 2% say worse




80% of churchgoers have not heard a sermon in the last year addressing sexual assault or sexual violence




72% consider their church at least somewhat prepared to help someone who has experienced sexual assault




81% consider their church at least somewhat prepared to protect children from sexual abuse in ministry programs




69% believe their church is more prepared to protect children from sexual abuse than 10 years ago

My church would be a good place for someone who experienced sexual abuse as a child or teen to find healing.

- Females are more likely to Strongly agree than males (63% v. 54%)
- Those in the Northeast are least likely to Strongly agree (49%)
- Those age 18-34 (64%) are more likely to Strongly agree than those 50-64 (58%) and 65+ (53%)
- Hispanics are most likely to Strongly agree (81%) while those of Other Ethnicities are least likely (36%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (65%) are more likely to Strongly agree than those with a Bachelor's (58%) or Graduate Degree (55%)
- Pentecostals/AG (80%), Non-denominational (70%), and Baptists (60%) are more likely to Strongly agree than Lutherans (47%), Methodists (47%) and Presbyterian/Reformed (38%)
- Those who attend once a week or more are more likely to Strongly agree than those who attend once or twice a month (64% v 43%)
- Self-identified evangelicals are more likely to Strongly agree than other attendees (67% v 48%)

- Those age 35-49 (64%) are more likely to Strongly agree than those 65+ (53%)
- Hispanics are most likely to Strongly agree (72%) while those of Other Ethnicities are least likely (38%)
- Those who are High School Graduates or less (63%) are more likely to Strongly agree than those with a Graduate Degree (57%)
- Pentecostals/AG (77%), Non-denominational (67%), and Baptists (62%) are more likely to Strongly agree than Lutherans (47%), Methodists (44%) and Presbyterian/Reformed (43%)
- Those who attend once a week or more are more likely to Strongly agree than those who attend once or twice a month (64% v 43%)
- Self-identified evangelicals are more likely to Strongly agree than other attendees (68% v 47%)

- Those age 18-34 are most likely to select “Yes” (10%), while those age 65+ are least likely (<1%)
- African Americans (10%) and Hispanics (10%) are more likely to select “Yes” than Whites (2%)
- Single (10%) and Divorced/separated attendees (7%) are more likely to select “Yes” than Married (3%) and Widowed attendees (<1%)
